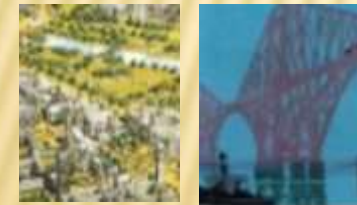
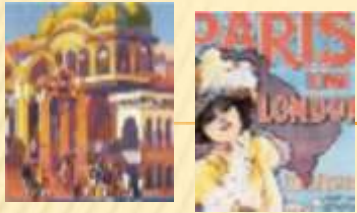
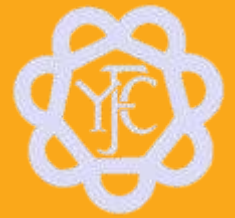


HOST FAMILY

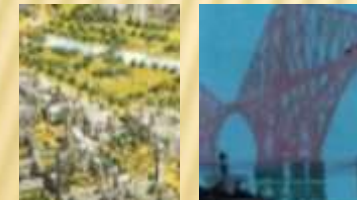
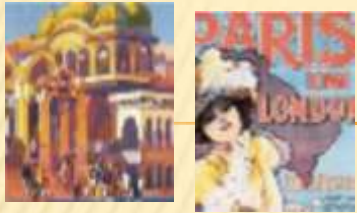


WE HELPED THE VILLAGE PLOUGH CROPS, PLANT THEM. PICK THEM AND WATER THEM. WE LEARNT ABOUT KENYA'S IMPORTS EXPORTS, CLIMATE, VEGETATION AND WAY OF FARMING. MOST OF THE PRODUCE THAT THE VILLAGE

PRODUCES THEY EAT THEMSELVES, AND THE REST THEY WILL EXCHANGE FOR OTHER GOODS AT THE LOCAL SHOP.



FARMS

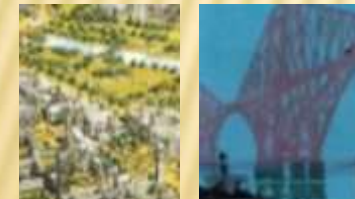
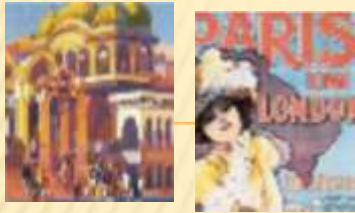


KENYA IS ONE OF THE POOREST COUNTRIES IN AFRICA. CROP FARMING IS A CHALLENGE BECAUSE 75% OF THE COUNTRY IS ARID AND SEMI-ARID. AS A RESULT MANY FARMERS RELY ON LIVESTOCK FOR THEIR INCOMES. EVERY HOUSE HAD A FARM AND MOSTLY WOMEN TOOK ON THE FARMING RESPONSIBILITIES.

THE FARMS WERE VERY SMALL, ONLY HAVING VERY LITTLE LAND. THE FARMERS WOULD HAVE A FEW CATTLE AND A COUPLE OF CHICKENS AND GOATS, WHICH THEN THEN HAVE MILK OFF BOTH THE CATTLE AND GOATS AND EGGS OF THE CHICKENS.



SCHOOLS AND EDUCATION

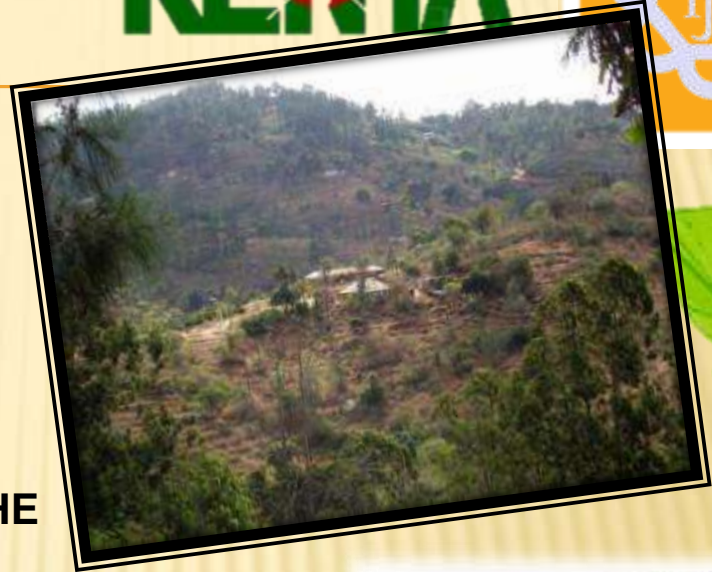
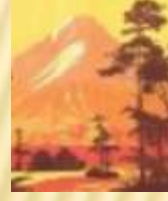
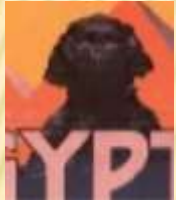


WE ALSO VISITED A LOCAL PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL. ALL THE CHILDREN WERE TAUGHT IN ENGLISH, AS ALL THE EXAMS THEY TAKE ARE GIVEN IN ENGLISH. THE CHILDREN HAVE TO PAY MONEY TO GO TO SCHOOL, AND THE MAJORITY BOARD STAY IN SCHOOL FOR

EACH TERM. THIS IS BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF SCHOOLS, AND THE DISTANCE SOME OF THE CHILDREN MIGHT HAVE TO TRAVEL TO GET THERE EVERY DAY. THE FACILITIES ARE FAIRLY BASIC, WITH SOME EQUIPMENT AND BOOKS. THE IMAGES ABOVE SHOW THE CLASSROOMS AND BOARDING ROOMS.

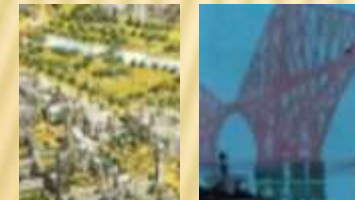
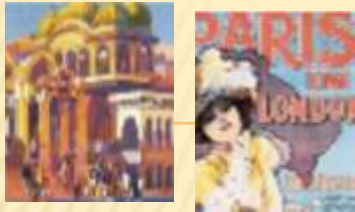
THE FOOD AVAILABLE WAS VERY DIFFERENT TO OUR OWN. THE IMAGE BELOW SHOWS A MEAL OF FISH AND VEGETABLES WHICH WAS THE FIRST MEAL WE HAD IN THE CITY.



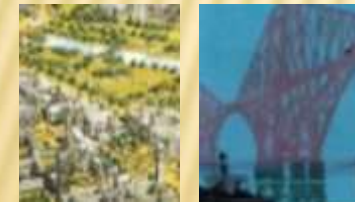
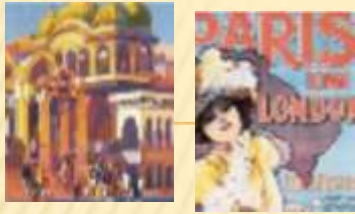
THE KENYAN DIET SEEMED TO CONSIST OF MAINLY BEANS, CABBAGE, CARROTS, CHIPATIES (WRAPS), MAISE AND UGALI (ROOT OF A TREE, TASTES LIKE POTATO). THESE INGREDIENTS SEEMED TO BE WITH MOST MEALS.



THEY ALSO ATE A LOT OF FRUIT, ALL THE FRUIT THEY DID EAT WAS PRODUCE THEY GREW THEMSELVES. ORANGES, LEMONS, BANANAS, MANGOS, AND GRAPEFRUIT.



HEALTH CENTRES AND HOSPITALS



ADEQUATE MEDICAL SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE IN NAIROBI, BUT NOT OUTSIDE IT. FREQUENT OUTBREAKS OF CHOLERA AND MALARIA ARE ENDEMIC IN KENYA OUTSIDE NAIROBI. AIDS, MALARIA AND ASTHMA ARE BIG HEALTH PROBLEMS OUT IN KENYA. TUBERCULOSIS IS ALSO AN INCREASINGLY SERIOUS HEALTH CONCERN IN KENYA. THERE ARE VERY FEW HEALTH CENTRES AND HOSPITALS OUTSIDE NAIROBI, SO IF SOMEONE DOES BECOME ILL THEY HAVE TO TRAVEL A FAIR DISTANCE TO SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION.



THERE ARE ALSO LIMITED TO WHAT THE DOCTORS CAN DO, AS WELL AS THE AMOUNT OF MEDICINE OR TREATMENT THEY CAN GIVE THEM, DUE TO THE SUPPLIES AVAILABLE AND AMOUNT OF PEOPLE USING THEM.



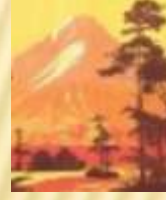

WE ALSO WENT TO THE LOCAL PUB A FEW TIMES TO RELAX AND HAVE A DRINK. THE BARS WERE NOT QUITE LIKE THE CLUBS WE HAVE IN BRITAIN! THE MOST POPULAR DRINK IN KENYA THAT MOST PEOPLE DRANK WAS TUSKER, AS SHOWN IN THE IMAGES.

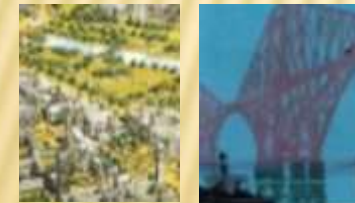
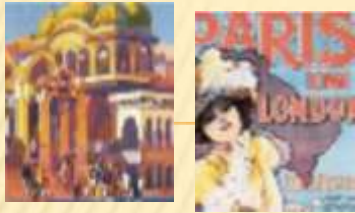
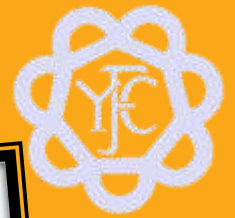


WE SPENT ONE AFTERNOON, LEARNING HOW THE VILLAGE PEOPLE HUNT FOR FOOD. MADE BOW AND ARROWS OUT OF WOOD, STRING, METAL ARROWS AND FEATHERS. THIS IS JUST ONE OF THE MALE CRAFTS THAT THE PEOPLE DO.

THE VILLAGE PEOPLE USED TO HUNT A LOT, BUT DUE TO THE LACK OF WILD ANIMALS NOW IN THE MOUNTAINOUS AREAS, IT IS NOT AS COMMON THESE DAYS. THE KENYA PEOPLE DIDN'T SEEM TO EAT MUCH MEAT, JUST ON SPECIAL OCCASSIONS. WITH THE BOWS AND ARROWS WE THEN MADE WE HAD AN ARCHERY COMPETION, WHICH OF COURSE I WON.



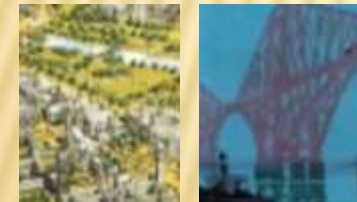
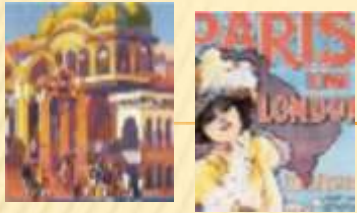
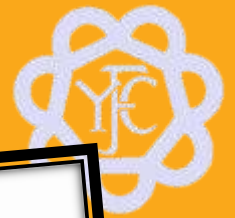
TEXTILES



WE DID TWO TEXTILE ACTIVITIES WHILE WE WERE WITH OUR HOSTS. THE FIRST ONE WAS A TRADITIONAL BASKET THE VILLAGE MAKE AND THEN SELL FOR MONEY. THE SECOND WAS A TRADITIONAL DANCE SKIRT WORN ON SPECIAL OCCASIONS. BOTH THE ITEMS WERE MADE FROM A PLANT CALLED THE SISAL PLANT, WHICH IS SPLIT APART, DRYED THEN WOVEN TO CREATE DIFFERENT PATTERNS. THE VILLAGERS ALSO USED VEGETABLE DIE TO MAKE THE ITEMS DIFFERENT COLOURS.



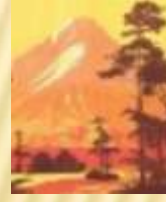
RELIGION



67% CHRISTIAN, 28% TRADITIONAL RELIGION, 5% MUSLIM. THE TRADITIONAL RELIGION IS RAPIDLY DISAPPEARING AS YOUNGER GENERATIONS ARE BORN INTO CHRISTIAN FAMILIES. CHRISTIANITY STARTED OFF IN SAGALLA BY SIR REV. JAMES, IN THE 1890'S. HE TRAVELED OVER FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM TO TEACH CHRISTIANITY. WITHOUT HIS INFLUENCE ALL THOSE YEARS AGO, WHO KNOWS WHAT WOULD BE THEIR MAIN RELIGION NOW.

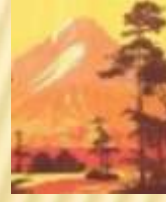
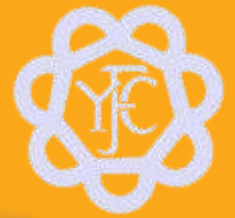


KENYA IS KNOWN ALL OVER THE WORLD FOR ITS SPECTACULAR SAFARI EXPERIENCES.

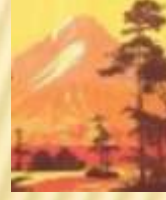
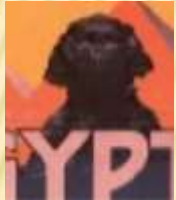
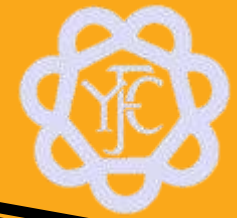
ANIMALS AND SAFARI

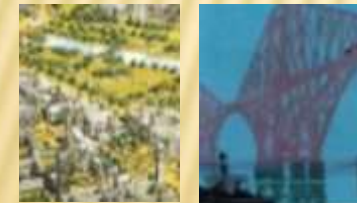
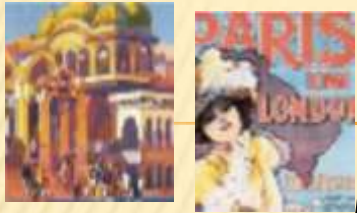
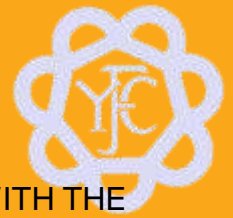
MASAMARA TRIBE

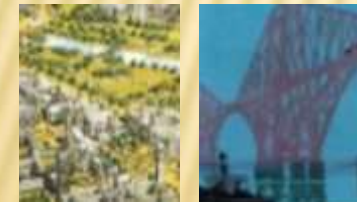
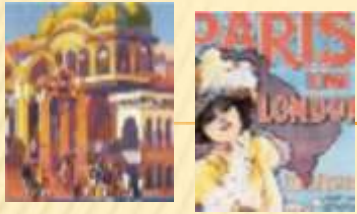
EXTRA 4 DAYS TRAVELING

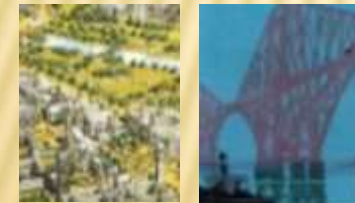
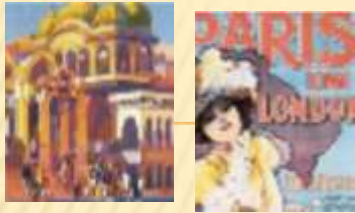
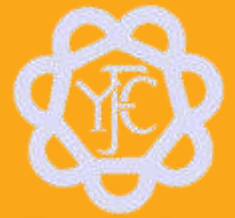
EXTRA 4 DAYS TRAVELING
