## Saturday Visits

### **Trip 1 (all day): Chester Zoo**

The UK's number one Zoo is set in 110 acres of award-winning gardens. In this spectacular setting are over 7000 animals with over 400 species of rare, exotic and endangered wildlife. Chester Zoo's gardens are deservedly famous and provide a glorious backdrop to the animals. With plants from around the world, the gardens reflect the natural habitats of some of our most exotic species. Play areas are spread around the Zoo to give the children the chance to burn off some energy and there are plenty of cafes onsite.

As there is so much to see at Chester Zoo this will be an all day trip.

### **Trip 2 (am): Pontcysyllte Boat Trip**

Come along for a spectacular trip on Jones the Boats narrow boat, 'Eirlys' across the famous Pontcysyllte aqueduct, one of the most enduring wonders of the waterways, which has inspired and amazed boaters, walkers and visitors for 200 years. On its completion in 1805 the aqueduct was the tallest canal boat crossing in the world and to this day it's the highest navigable aqueduct in the world, 126 feet above the valley floor. Don't miss the opportunity to visit one of Thomas Telford's greatest civil engineering achievements, which is now officially a World Heritage Site, putting it on a par with places like the Pyramids, Machu Picchu, the Taj Mahal and the Acropolis. And if that's not worth experiencing, we don't know what is!

### **Trip 3 (am): Ifor Williams Trailers, Deeside**

Take this rare opportunity to visit the Deeside Manufacturing Facility of one of the most famous names in trailers. Ifor Williams Trailers is Britain's largest manufacturer of trailers up to 3500kg gross weight. Their livestock trailers are the preferred choice for many farmers. For half a century, customers have been turning to Ifor Williams Trailers to make their working lives easier and their leisure time better and now, you can visit the factory where they manufacture flat bed trailers and horse boxes.

### **Trip 4 (am): Nant Ucha Egg Farm and Sign Writing Workshop**

You have free range eggs and then you have Nant Ucha free range eggs. Take this opportunity to visit a family run free range egg unit in the wilds of Garth, Llangollen, where you will meet the Kynaston family and 4200 of 'their girls'. Follow the free range process from laying, through collecting and grading, to packing and distribution. Also based here is David Kynaston, who is one of a dying breed of traditional sign writers. Visit David's workshop and learn the finer points of his trade. This is an eggcellent opportunity to witness farm diversification first hand.

### **Trip 5 (am): Go Karting**

Have a go at Go Karting on this cleverly designed track where somebody obviously thought... how about a tunnel, or a banked hairpin or should it be outdoors or indoors? And then decided to have them all! It is one of the longest established indoor karting centres in Europe. The 900m circuit packs in plenty of twists and turns, and it's up to you when to brake and when to really let your 200cc biz kart off the leash. It's a real taste of competitive motor racing, with its very own 30m Monaco style tunnel.

### **Trip 6 (am): Stay at the Hotel**

Marvel at the terraces, fountains and colourful arches or enjoy the sensational aroma of the herb garden. Enjoy the delights of a country garden and at the same time see how the wonderful Llaeth y Llan yogurt is produced.

### **Trip 8 (pm): Greenfield Valley and Holywell [www.greenfieldvalley.com](http://www.greenfieldvalley.com)**

The 70 acre Greenfield Valley Heritage Park has, at its focal point, the museum and farm. As well as an attractive collection of original and reconstructed local buildings, the museum includes many fascinating antique farm tools and one of the oldest self propelled combines in the world. For children there are farm animals, Toddler Tractor Heaven, Tower Maze and Adventure TreeHouse. The site includes the ruins of Basingwerk Abbey and Tea Rooms. A short walk away is St Winefride's Well at Holywell, the 'Lourdes of Wales'. There is something for everyone on this trip.

### **Trip 9 (pm): Ruthin Market Town**

Visit the delightful market town of Ruthin nestling in the spectacular Vale of Clwyd. There is plenty to do! Visit **Ruthin Craft Centre**, the premier centre for the display of Contemporary Applied Art in the UK. It houses artists' workshops, a cafe, craft showcase and spectacular galleries. Or for a gruelling experience venture into the

impressive **Ruthin Gaol** (*Trip 10*) to experience life as a Victorian Prisoner! Explore the cells including the punishment, 'dark' and condemned cell. Find out about the Welsh Houdini and William Hughes the last man to be hanged there... You can also join in the Halloween celebrations at the Gaol with crafts and storytelling, where children are invited to wear fancy dress! Today, Ruthin Gaol also provides safe and secure storage for the county archives. Not brave enough to venture into Gaol! Then you may prefer a bit of **shopping** in the town's small boutiques or visit **Ruthin Castle** and pop into the hotel for afternoon tea. Ruthin people say that it's the most charming small town in Wales. We agree with them. Why not visit to find out for yourself!

### **Trip 11 (pm): Ice Skating**

Ice Skating is fun and the perfect exercise for all ages! Whether you're an experienced skater or a novice, you can enjoy the fantastic facilities at Deeside Ice Rink, in Queensferry. This Olympic sized ice rink is the National Centre for Ice Sports in Wales, and a session on the ice is just the thing for developing a thirst in preparation for Saturday evening!

During our reunion, the choir will be joined by the Trawsfynydd singer Geraint Roberts. Geraint has released two musical CDs, is a familiar voice on Radio Cymru and he has taken lead parts with the Meirionnydd Musical Theatre Company.

### **Getting to the 2011 Reunion**

#### **By Road from the North and Manchester**

From the west end of the M56 (via Chester Services), continue on the A494 towards Queensferry and North Wales. Continue past the Queensferry junction, then take the B5127 junction (sp Buckley). Take the first exit on the roundabout (sp St David's Park), and then the third exit on the next roundabout. The hotel is immediately on the right.

#### **By road from Mid Wales (via Wrexham) and the South (via Whitchurch)**

Join the Chester southern Bypass (A55) westbound towards North Wales. Continue past J35, keeping right on the A494. Take the B5127 junction (sp Ewloe and Buckley). Take the fourth exit on the roundabout (sp St David's Park), and then the third exit on the next roundabout. The hotel is immediately on the right.

#### **By road from North Wales and Holyhead (A55 eastbound)**

Stay on the dual carriageway when the A55 becomes the A494. Immediately take the B5127 junction (sp Ewloe and Buckley). Take the fourth exit on the roundabout (sp St David's Park), and then the third exit on the next roundabout. The hotel is immediately on the right.

Shotton Mainline Station is only 10 minutes from the Hotel.

#### **By Air**

Manchester International Airport is 1 hour 30 minutes by train from Shotton Mainline Station. Liverpool John Lennon Airport is the closest airport to Ewloe, but there is a short coach transfer to Liverpool Lime Street Train Station, followed by a 45 minute train transfer to Shotton. We will arrange direct coach transfers from the airports if there is sufficient demand.

**Transport will be arranged from Shotton Train Station.**

## **Extending your stay?**

There is plenty to see and plenty to do in the area. Here are a few options.

On our doorstep is Ewloe castle, one of many castles within ½ hour drive from the hotel, Gladstone Library at St Deiniol's and Hawarden Estate Farm Shop.

Picturesque Llangollen is worth a visit, home of the International Eisteddfod, with a steam train, abbey, canal and Plas Mawr, the home of The Ladies of Llangollen.

Two large Welsh National Trust properties in the area are Erddig Hall (voted the nation's second favourite stately home) and Chirk Castle. Set on the banks of the River Dee is Ness Botanic Gardens.

Down the road, Wrexham is the home of the oldest international football in the world currently in use. Also in Wrexham is St Giles Church, whose steeple is one of the Seven Wonders of Wales. Also in the town you'll find a range of shops, Waterworld and a museum.

If you'd like to find out more about canals, the National Waterways Museum, at Ellesmere Port is well worth a visit. Close by, at Cheshire Oaks you'll find the UK's largest Designer Outlet Village and the Blue Planet Aquarium.

The Chairman welcomed the UK members, the President of EIFYEAA, Martyn Quayle and the visitors from the Netherlands, Norway and Switzerland to the 54<sup>th</sup> UK Young Farmers Ambassador's Annual General Meeting.

#### **1. Apologies for Absence**

#### **2. Minutes of the 2009 Annual General Meeting**

#### **3. Matters arising from the Minutes**

#### **4. Correspondence**

The only correspondence received has been already dealt with under apologies for absence.

#### **5. Executive Committee Meeting**

The Executive Meeting was held on Saturday evening. The items discussed included:

(1) Circulation of conference brochures: This year's reunion organising committee has emailed the brochure to as many members as possible to reduce postage costs. Member's email addresses were provided by the country secretaries and the application form was available for download from the website. Future reunion brochures will be circulated in this manner - unless country secretaries advise of the members who require the brochure to be posted.

(2) AGM Minute and Attendance Journals: The Scottish 2010 reunion committee has presented the UK YFA organisation with new journals, as the current journals are full.

(3) Rotating £400 reunion grant; the rotating grant which moves between countries to assist in the early stages of reunion planning is no longer required – as countries have sufficient funds to cover these early costs themselves. Countries were requested to consider the grant at their country meetings and report back to the AGM. At this point a proposal was out to the members.

**Recommendation:** The rotating £400.00 grant be disbanded and £100 to be given each country, was unanimously agreed by the members.

(4) History of YFA: YFA holds journals, which include the minutes and attendance lists from all of the YFA reunions. Sally has agreed to convert these documents into electronic versions to safe guard the information for the future and to make it available to members.

YFA again took a very active role in the Discovery Programme Selection and Briefing in December 2009, with members prominent on all selection panels, and others persuading exchangees to join YFA. There were more places available than in recent years, and all spaces were eventually filled.

At the NFYFC Annual Convention and AGM in Torquay, Rhiannon Dafydd presented a cheque for £3,200 as part of our continuing commitment to the future of the Discovery Programme. She also presented the YFA Trophy to the 2009 English European Rally Team for their winning promotional PowerPoint.

The Wales Reunion Committee held yet another very successful reception at the Royal Welsh Show in July. For the first time, all incoming exchangees on the Wales International Programme were at the show, and many of them attended the Reception, along with some of the outgoing exchangees. Some exchangees were persuaded to join YFA during the Reception, for which England and Wales YFA are very grateful.

A request was made in our AGM at Newcastle that a Questionnaire is sent out to members to find out whether they are happy with their YFA and what they want out of YFA. The results were published in the autumn 2010 Newsletter, which is available for all to see on the Website.
